## Tip #2

Remember that no matter how well-written your ending, some readers will simply not like it. That's okay! Most of the time, readers don't like an ending because it doesn't match their expectations or desires for the characters. It doesn't mean you're a bad writer. It means that the story just wasn't for them.
